

Son of God

What does it mean that Jesus is the Son of God? As Christians, we know that Jesus is God the Son, the second Person of the Trinity. He is One with His Father in essence, equal with Him, and yet a distinct Person. This is, of course, the most important and most essential aspect of what it means that Jesus is the Son of God, but there are a few more layers to it that are important for us to understand.

In the Bible, Jesus isn't the only one who is called the Son of God. Adam is called the Son of God (Luke 3:38). Israel is called the Son of God (Exodus 4:22-23, Hosea 11:1). The Kings in the line of David are called God's Sons (2 Samuel 7:12-13, Psalm 2:7-9). And they aren't the only ones. When the New Testament calls Jesus the Son of God, it's picking up and building on these other references to sons of God from the Old Testament. In Jesus, these previous sons of God find their fulfillment. They were sons of God in an incomplete sense, but Jesus is the Son of God in the fullest sense. In other words, "In the past, God spoke to our ancestors through the prophets at many times and in various ways, but in these last days he has spoken to us by his Son". So that means that there are several layers to Jesus' identity as the Son of God, and unless we understand all those layers, we don't have the full picture.

The first layer we need to understand is that Jesus is the Son of God because he is the head of a new humanity, a new people of God. When Luke calls Adam the son of God in Luke 3:38, it's in the context of the genealogy of Jesus, traced through his adopted father, Joseph. A couple chapters earlier in Luke's gospel, we are given another one of the most important references to the Son of God in the Bible:

But the angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary; you have found favor with God. You will conceive and give birth to a son, and you are to call him Jesus. He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High. The Lord God will give him the throne of his father David, and he will reign over Jacob's descendants forever; his kingdom will never end."

"How will this be," Mary asked the angel, "since I am a virgin?"

The angel answered, "The Holy Spirit will come on you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you. So the holy one to be born will be called the Son of God. (Luke 1:30-35, NIV)

The angel Gabriel tells Mary that Jesus will be "the Son of the Most High", and then when he explains the virgin conception, he says, "So the holy one to be born will be called the Son of God." In the virgin conception, God did something that he hadn't done since Adam and Eve, he created new life. God created Adam out of the dust and Eve out of Adam's rib. Ever since then, life came by procreation, not creation. But when Jesus was born, there was no procreation. God overshadowed Mary and created a human life using half the raw materials required for procreation. Jesus was like Adam, a human directly created by God. A Son of God. And so Jesus, like Adam, was created without sin.

This theme can be taken a step further when we remember that Israel was also called God's

son. The were the people that God chose out of all the nations of the world to be his treasured and holy people (Deuteronomy 7:6). But just like Adam, Israel failed. They couldn't be what God called them to be, because they were sinful. Jesus, however, as the holy Son of God, could do and be everything Israel failed to do and be. Matthew's gospel is set up to show how Jesus filled up every area in which Israel fell short. He even quotes Hosea 11:1, connecting Jesus the Son of God to Israel, the son of God (Matthew 2:15).

Because Jesus is the Son of God, the new humanity, the new Adam, the new Israel, the perfect holy person, He was fit to bring redemption to sinners. As the new Adam, He is a new representative for the human race. Romans 5:12-19 tell us that when Adam sinned, all humanity was condemned in him. But Jesus is a new Adam who did not sin, and so is the new representative for a new humanity. All those in Jesus are not condemned, but made righteous and made new (2 Corinthians 5:17). As the new Israel, He was able to fulfill God's law for us, both by completely obeying it, but also by acting as our High Priest and by giving Himself as the once and for all sacrifice that made purification for our sins (Hebrews 1:3, 9:11-14).

Jesus the Son of God means Jesus the head of the new human race, the new people of God. It means Jesus the one who is able to redeem us and purify us and give us new life in Him. That's one of the layers; there are two more, but I'm out of space, so if you want to know more, you'll have to check out the full article on our blog. MINISTRY UPDATE: Food Bank

On the second Wednesday of each month, we have the opportunity to run a foodbank that reaches 20-35 members of our community. We open the doors at 9:30 AM and have a chance to chat with the group as they grab coffee and cookies. Then at 9:45 we give some announcements and a short 10-15 minute devotion that is centred on the gospel and points people to Christ. The group is a good mixture of Christians and non-Christians and there are often good questions and comments. After that, we send people down to the foodbank room in groups of three to get their food, and there is lots of time for getting to know each other and having good conversations while everyone waits to go downstairs.

This ministry has been used by God to help a lot of people both physically and spiritually in the past several years, and we are thankful to all those who donate food or give to the benevolent fund in order to make this ministry possible. We are also thankful to the shoppers who use benevolent funds to buy food and for the volunteers who stock the shelves, give food out, set up the coffee and cookies, sign people in, give the devotion, and chat with people. And of course, we are thankful for everyone who prays for this ministry.

As you can imagine, it takes a lot of shopping to keep our shelves filled with nutritious food and toiletries. 


