



Read Psalm 119:33-48 together. Psalm 119 is the longest chapter in the Bible and it is a love song. But the song isn't written about a person – it is about God's Word. What strikes you in this passage about how the psalmist loves God's Word?

Does your attitude towards the Bible match up to the psalmist's attitude? In what ways does your attitude towards the Bible fall short of what it should be?

What do you think are some of the things in life that distract you from God's Word or turn your heart away from loving it as you should?

Why should we love God's Word so much? (Look at Psalm 19:7, Psalm 119:1-3, 9-11)

The Pharisees loved God's Word because they thought that by following it, they could be good enough for God to accept. But what does Jesus say in John 5:39-40 and John 6:27-29? What is the most important thing that the Bible shows us?

How did this truth help Jesus' disciples to stick with Him when they didn't understand Him? (Take a look at John 6:66-69.)

More than anything or anyone else, we need Jesus. The Bible shows Him to us. How can we take steps this week to remember how much we need God's Word and love it more as a result?
