



Discussion Questions

1. Read Revelation 5:1-14
2. In this chapter, the apostle John has a vision of the throne room in heaven. In the vision, God is holding a scroll that represents His plan to restore the world, but there is a problem. What is the problem?
3. But then Jesus comes and is worthy to open the scroll. He takes it from His Father and all the angels around the throne sing a new song to Him and declare that He is worthy to open the scroll. Why is He worthy?
4. Why does His death make Him worthy? What does His death have to do with the scroll?
5. What did His death accomplish?
6. What are the implications for missions? How should we view missions differently because of this?
7. What should we do about it? How can you be involved in these kinds of missions?
8. What has Jesus purchased these people (including us!) to do and be?
9. What does it mean that you are part of a kingdom?
10. What does it mean that you are a priest?
11. What does all this mean for the way we view ourselves and others around the world?
12. In what ways can we be more like Christ the humble servant as we live and share the gospel?
13. When we think about missions, we often think that it is important because we care about the people that need Jesus. That's a really good reason. But what's an even greater reason? What are verses 11-14 all about?
14. How does the worth and greatness of Jesus motivate you to be involved in missions? What difference does it make (or should it make) in the way you think about it and do it?
