- 1. Read Luke 19:28-44
- 2. This is a familiar story but Luke tells it a little differently than the other gospel writers do. What's missing that we're used to and what's added that we're not used to? What might be the point Luke is trying to make by telling the story this way?
- 3. What does Luke 19:38 have in common with Luke 2:14? How are they different? What might be the point Luke is trying to make in pointing out these similarities and differences?
- 4. How are peace in heaven and peace on earth linked? Why did Jesus's disciples miss that link? What were they expecting?
- 5. How do verses 39-44 of Luke 19 crush those expectations?
- 6. How did the rejection of King Jesus purchase peace?
- 7. What does it look like to follow Jesus as king in your life?
- 8. Do you really believe that following Jesus as king will bring peace in your life? Do you have any examples of how that has been true in your life?
- 9. Are there any areas where you know you struggle to let Jesus be the king? How can we help each other with these struggles?
